










Does anyone have a heated large garage, know of a school or community building? We need fresh ideas for our meetings and tours!

James Rexford Barker has been a long time member of the Midwest Antique Auto Club. He was born March 28, 1934 in Omaha, NE to Rex & Irene Barker. He graduated from Omaha Technical High School in 1952. He was married to Noreen Langan (preceded him in death). They were blessed with five children: Rex, John, Ann, Mary, and Thomas. Jim worked in Seattle in the logging industry and on a fishing boat. After moving back to Omaha, Jim worked as a television repairman before starting Seat Cover Center of Nebraska. This was the pre-eminent auto upholstery business in Omaha for over 50 years. He retired from the business when he was 80 years old. Jim died on Sunday, November 19th, 2017 at Bergen Mercy Hospital in Omaha following surgery at the age of 83. Jim is survived by sons and daughters -in-law: Rex & Mary of Omaha, John & Brooke of Palmyra, NE, and Thomas & Michelle of Port Charlotte, Florida; daughters and sons-in law: Ann & Brian Miller of Papillion and Mary & Steven Thacker of Clinton, IA; 10 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren; and sister Patricia Brisbay of Pearland, TX. Internment was at Prospect Hill cemetery in Elkhorn, NE. Military Honors were conducted with taps played. Memorials are suggested to St. Patrick's Catholic Church or Open Door Mission.

HOW ABOUT A MOVIE-A DRIVE IN MOVIE! Well, here is some history.

Information in this little article is from a book by Don and Susan Sanders "The American Drive-In Movie Theatre ((2013 Edition by Crestline w/ arrangements with Motorbooks International). It states that the automobile and the motion picture were born just 12 years apart. The Duryea(automobile) was out on the road in 1893, and the motion picture arrived in 1905. The fascinating world of the mechanics of both the moving picture and the automobile were intertwined. The nickelodeon theaters were 5 cents and one could watch a moving picture. Silent movies were next, and vaudeville was basically gone. Watching movies under the stars was taking shape with outdoor theaters like the 1915 Air Dome Theater on Fremont St. in Las Vegas, NV. These had rows and rows of seats with a very large screen up front. Cruise lines also offered outdoor theaters. The automobile not only represented a new independence, but was also the main "action" figure (along with trains) seen in these old movies. This wonderful book also gives the history of the "Father of the Drive-In Theater". "As the story goes, it all happened in the driveway of Hollingshead's Riverton, New Jersey home. Trying to find a way to combine America's two great love affairs- the automobile and the movies-Hollingshead sat a Kodak 16mm projector on the hood of his car and spooled up some old home movies" (Sanders & Sanders, Pg. 13) After various adjustments and testing with sound(radio) and different natural back ground sounds he also devised an upward ramp system. The ramp would become the basis for his patent. His idea opened to the public in 1933, it allowed smoking, chatting, and the car became a private theater box unlike the indoor theaters. This theater opened to a full house on June 6, 1933.
